



DUBAI city architectural idea for a tall emblem structure

On the ground the towers are connected by a podium where the conference hall and child library are taking place.

The two-store podium, even with its 10 m height is only a fragment of the towers.

The conference hall takes the centre of the building, placed in a space with the shape of an eye.

This latter can be divided into two triangular and a quad space.

The height of the hall is great, the roof is covered by glass to make the upper structure and the glass ball itself visible.

The main entrance opens from the side of the lake.

The glass wall offers a magnificent view to the surrounding park.

The entrance faces hall in which the reception and other supplementary services might take place, but it might also be suitable for temporary exhibitions. Two curved stairs lead to the gallery, from where, through a window with shutters one might gain insight to the conference hall, as the case may be in the opposite side of the conference hall the service rooms (toilettes, storages, mechanical room, etc.) are taken place. The upper storey of the library opens from the gallery.

The two storey of the library is connectable inside the library by stairs and by elevator as well.

The vertical circulation within the towers is solved each by the help of an elevator and fire protected staircases around them.

These are leading to the Café, the terraces and the underground parking.
